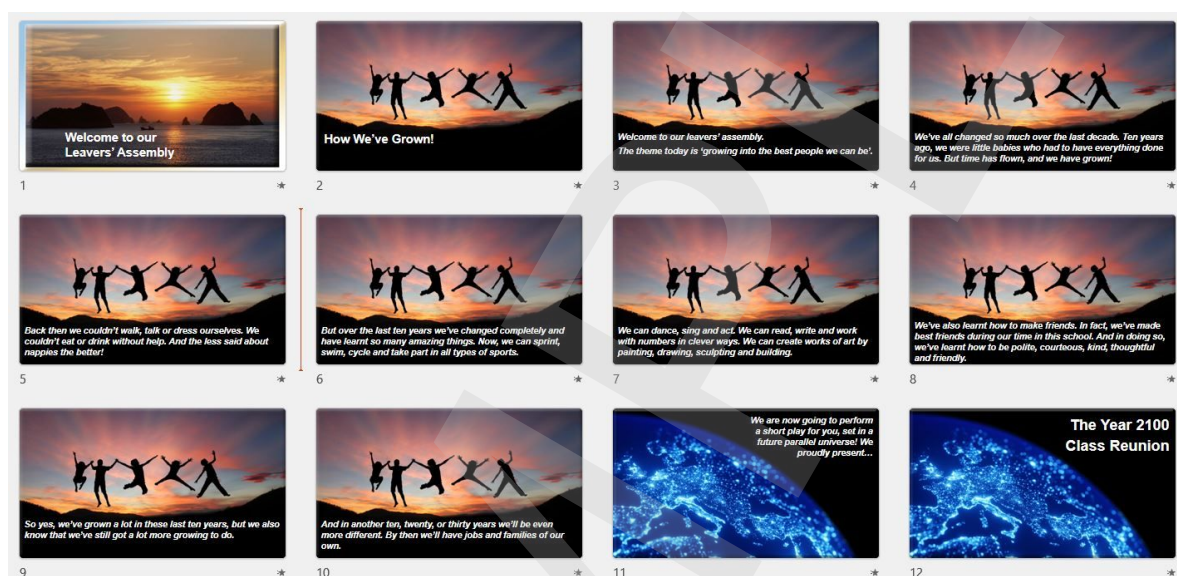


## MOVING ON LEAVERS' ASSEMBLY - SAMPLE DOCUMENT

### INTRODUCTION

#### How We've Grown

NARRATOR 1

Welcome to our leavers' assembly. The theme today is 'growing into the best people we can be'.

NARRATOR 2      We've all changed so much over the last decade. Ten years ago, we were little babies who had to have everything done for us. But time has flown, and we have grown!

NARRATOR 3      Back then we couldn't walk, talk or dress ourselves. We couldn't eat or drink without help. And the less said about nappies the better!

NARRATOR 4      But over the last ten years we've changed completely and have learnt so many amazing things. Now, we can sprint, swim, cycle and take part in all types of sports.

NARRATOR 5      We can dance, sing and act. We can read, write and work with numbers in clever ways. We can create works of art by painting, drawing, sculpting and building.

NARRATOR 6      We've also learnt how to make friends. In fact, we've made best friends during our time in this school. And in doing so, we've learnt how to be polite, courteous, kind, thoughtful and friendly.

NARRATOR 7      So yes, we've grown a lot in these last ten years, but we also know that we've still got a lot more growing to do. And in another ten, twenty, or thirty years we'll be even more different. By then we'll have jobs and families of our own.

## **PLAY**

### **The Year 2100 Class Reunion**

NARRATOR 8      We are now going to perform a short play for you, set in a future parallel universe! We proudly present, 'The Year 2100 Class Reunion'.

*(A dozen or so children enter, all dressed as very old people).*

CLASSMATE 1      Wow, we've made it to the year 2100. Isn't it strange how things change over time? When I was a child our national football team couldn't win a thing, but now they've gone and won the World Cup five times in a row!

CLASSMATE 2      Not everything changes though. You'll never guess what new album I just listened to, 'Now That's What I Call Music 4792'!

CLASSMATE 3      I'm just glad to have made it to the reunion at all. The space pilots are on strike again, so I had to teleport here from my home on the moon. I hate having all the atoms in my body taken apart and then reassembled. I always feel like I've got something missing!

CLASSMATE 2      Your brain as usual?

BILLIE BUMBLE Welcome everyone to the Clear River Primary School class reunion. For those that don't remember, my name is Billie Bumble. I was head pupil way back in 2023. It's now the year 2100 and it's been a very long time since most of us have last seen each other. Understandably, we're all looking ancient compared to how we did all those decades ago.

CLASSMATE 4 Speak for yourself! I just had my fourteenth round of age-reversing ultrasonic beam therapy. I don't look a day over 21.

CLASSMATE 5 You sure you don't mean 71?

SKY SIMPLETON And my name is Sky Simpleton, former deputy head pupil of Clear River Primary School. Over time, most of the rivers on earth have vanished, and those that are left are far from being filled with 'clear' water. Even our good old school closed for good when rising sea levels caused our old hometown to become permanently flooded. That's why we're meeting here, on this luxury private space station, exactly four hundred kilometres above where our old school used to be.

BILLIE BUMBLE All those years ago, Sky and I made a pact that when we reached the turn of the century, we would organise a school reunion to see how we have all changed over the years. So, here we are. I know you are all desperate to catch up with one another during the party which we have planned for later. But first, we have a surprise for you all.

SKY SIMPLETON We've invited some of our most famous former classmates to briefly tell us how their lives have changed over the years, sharing not just their greatest achievements, but also their biggest regrets. And if the thought of 'sharing regrets' sounds a bit negative, don't worry, there is an excellent reason for it which you'll find out later when we reveal a mind-blowing surprise! So, without any further ado, let's welcome our first guest, Robin Rich.

ROBIN RICH Hello!

SKY SIMPLETON Great to see you, Robin. So, what have you been up to?

ROBIN RICH Well before I retired ten years ago, I worked as a stockbroker. I worked extremely hard, and in the end, I made an absolute fortune. In fact, I became one of the wealthiest people in the world. *(There is a big gasp from the other ex-pupils)*

SKY SIMPLETON Wow! That sounds incredible. You must have had a great time spending all those riches. But do you have any regrets?

ROBIN RICH I'm afraid so. I was always so busy with work that I never found the time for anything else... (END OF SAMPLE)

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## WHAT FOLLOWS?

1. The remainder of this playscript, (which covers another five and a half pages).

In the play we meet four more main characters: Sidney Slug who lived an ordinary life but gave up the opportunity to become a professional sports star. Charity Champion, who has undertaken some remarkable charity work. Mo Medley, who has become a world-famous pop star! And finally, Pat Proton, a renowned scientist who has a remarkable surprise for everyone! We also hear plenty more humorous asides from several more unnamed 'classmates'.

The themes of the play that become evident are, living the best lives we can by being the best people we can be, as well as environmental issues to do with protecting our planet. This final theme leads perfectly into the next song:

2. SONG: Green Tree Blue Sky

3. Presentation: 'Growing Like Trees'. A PowerPoint version of this presentation is also included. (Screenshot below). This short presentation uses the examples of different types of trees to encourage the children to be the best people they can be, which aptly leads into the next song:

4. SONG: The Very Best Me That I Can Be

5. Optional Prayer (short and simple)

6. SONG: The Lord's Prayer (again optional)

7. Conclusion: Here the children read out thank you messages to friends, teachers and family.

8. SONG: Goodbye

9. On the final page is a series of alternative ideas, should you wish to replace, or add to any section of this entire assembly presentation.
