

### WHAT A STAR - SCRIPT SAMPLE

#### INTRODUCTION

Thank you for looking at this sample from 'What A Star!' There are two different scripts that can be used to stage this simple 9 song musical. Both scripts are included as part of the material you receive. Each script tells the same story, but in slightly different ways:

- FULL PLAY SCRIPT VERSION: This is a simple rhyming script which has spoken parts for dozens of children, though it can easily be adapted to be performed with just a handful of children if required.
- SIMPLE SCRIPT VERSION: The simple script tells the story entirely through narrators. This script
  has been designed so that even the youngest of children can appreciate and understand the story. It
  can be performed with or without actors, costumes, scenery, etc, and can therefore be extremely
  easy to stage. With this in mind the following notes and cast list deal with the FULL PLAY SCRIPT
  version.

EDITABLE SCRIPTS: Whatever script you use it's important to remember that you will receive editable versions of both scripts, so that you can easily adapt them to suit your specific requirements.

DISCLAIMER: Only partial song lyrics have been included for copyright reasons. Please remember that you can hear samples from every track online.

TIMING: If you stick exactly to either script, this performance should take about 20-25 minutes. If this is too long or too short for you, suggestions are included as part of the material you receive, which should help you easily shorten or lengthen the production by up to 10 minutes either way.

#### **CAST LIST**

Part	Details
Narrator/s	In total there are around 90 narrators' lines in the playscript arranged into about 23 different passages.
Leo the Little Star	Leo is on stage for the whole performance. Leo has 11 lines to say and can perform song 4 as a solo if required.
Big Stars	Up to 6 children dressed as 'big stars' have one line each at the start of the play. They come on stage again near the end.
Leo's Parents	Leo's mother star and father star have 5 lines each.
Angel	One angel has a few small lines to say. He/she can also perform song 3 as a solo if required.
Choir of Angels	A choir of angels have 6 lines to say altogether.
Wise Men	Three wise men have 2-3 lines each. They can also perform song 5 as a trio if required.
Shepherds	Three shepherds have one line each. They can also perform song 7 as a trio if required.
Mary & Joseph	Mary and Joseph have 2 lines each.
Optional Extras	Ideas for including several more optional roles are included as part of the material you will receive after purchase.

# **SAMPLE**

DAD: Keep trying and you can be the greatest star in space.

LEO: I wish I was bigger and brighter,

Then I'd have some friends.

MUM: We love you just the way you are!

DAD: Be patient, you'll grow big in the end. (Leo's parents exit)

SONG 2: Leo The Little Star
