## **SAMPLE DOCUMENT - INTRODUCTION**

### **TWO EDITABLE SCRIPTS**

Thank you for looking at this sample from "CHRISTMAS Spells Christmas For INFANTS." There are two different scripts that can be used to stage this simple musical. Both scripts are included as part of the material you receive.

PLAY SCRIPT: This is a simple rhyming script with spoken parts for dozens of children, though it can easily be adapted to be performed with just a few children if required.

NARRATED SCRIPT: This is a simple rhyming script, with the story told entirely through narrators. It can be performed with or without actors, costumes, scenery, etc, and can therefore be extremely easy to stage.

EDITABLE SCRIPTS: It's important to remember that you will receive editable versions of both these scripts so that you can easily make any changes you feel necessary, in order to make the script more suitable for your particular requirements.

TIMING: If you stick exactly to either script, this performance should take about 20 -25 minutes. If this is too long or too short for you, suggestions are included as part of the material you receive, which should help you easily shorten or lengthen the production by 10-15 minutes either way.

## **CAST LIST FOR PLAY SCRIPT VERSION**

<i>Part</i>	<i>Details</i>
Narrator/s	There are 15 passages in the play script marked as 'NARRATOR', which in total contain around 45 lines. Therefore, these narrators' sections could provide speaking parts for a large number of children depending on how you choose to divide the passages.
Letter children	Nine children need to hold the nine letters that spell Christmas. They can simply hold up their letters at the appropriate point or they can read out the appropriate narrator's part as well.
Mary	Mary is on stage for most of the performance. She can sing the second verse of song 7 as a solo if you wish. She also has six lines.
Joseph	Joseph is on stage for most of the play and has eight lines.
Angels	There are nine lines in the script marked as being for an angel / angels, but you can have as many angels as you wish.
Three shepherds	Three shepherds have one line each.
Three wise men	Three wise men have one or two lines each.
Three innkeepers	The three innkeepers have one line each. The third innkeeper also has an optional solo for the last verse of song 4.
Donkey	A non-speaking part, but feel free to get the donkey to add an 'ee-aw' or two!
Optional extras	Ideas are included, as part of your purchase, for ways to involve extra parts if required.
